What we achieved

Across the motu:

- We held **10 Conferences** from **Golden Bay** to **Invercargill**
- A total of 548 adults, youth, junior youth and children attended these conferences and participated in meaningful discussion, building stronger bonds of friendship, expressing spiritual themes in creative ways, and receiving the spiritual energies released from the Holy Land

 186 of these participants were friends of the Faith

- 94 children enjoyed a children's programme designed to reflect their spiritual qualities
- 56 youth and junior youth participated in exploration of spiritual themes or supporting the children in their learning

Key Learnings

WHAT CAPACITIES HAVE BEEN BUILT OR FURTHER STRENGTHENED IN YOUR LOCAL COMMUNITY, INSTITUTIONS AND INDIVIDUALS?

- Strengthened mutual support and assistance between individuals, institutions and communities
 - Regional Baha'i Council met with all Local Spiritual Assembly before the conferences
 - Collaboration of Local Spiritual Assemblies of near and far communities
 - Willingness of facilitators to travel and support other conferences especially in light of Covid
- Facilitating and engaging with artistic endeavours at the grassroots
 - A truly diverse range of artistic endeavours from collective collages, harakeke weaving to musical performances and dramatic presentations
- Capacity to invite friends and have meaningful conversations and nurture outward-looking communities
 - Almost 200 friends of the Faith participating
 - Facilitators skilfully engaging and supporting participants to explore what a vibrant community would look like

Working in groups of two or three was really a good strategy to get people making friends and talking.
